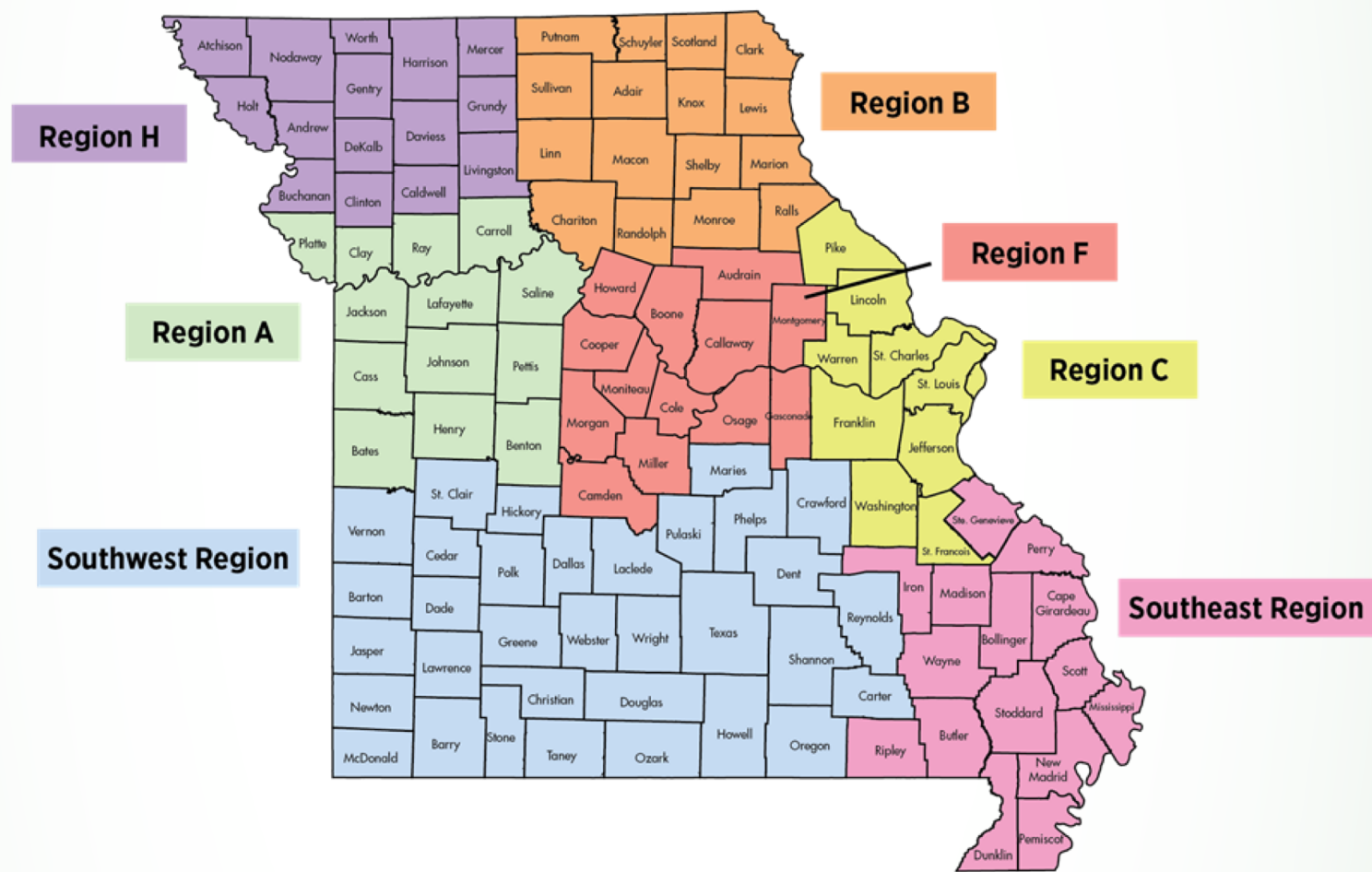

What is a Healthcare Coalition?

- An HCC is defined as a “**collaborative network** of healthcare organizations and their respective public and private sector response partners. . . . that serve as a **multiagency coordinating group** to assist with preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation activities related to **healthcare organization disaster operations**”



Missouri's Healthcare Coalitions



Our Purpose

- **Communicate** and **coordinate** health care information during all incidents impacting public health and medical operations.
- HCCs should **never replace or interfere** with official command and control structure authorized by state and local emergency management.



Incident Recognition

- Primary coalition communication and coordination should occur **virtually** through *sequential* and *redundant* methods of communication accessible to all HCC members.
- Non-urban Missouri HCCs and the MHA Coordinating Council have **adopted the Juvare EMResource and eICS platform** for primary monitoring and notification tools for HCC members.
 - Bridges to WebEOC established and tested.

Mass Casualty Incident/Communication Trailers

- Sixteen (16) Trailers
 - Eight (8) Command Only



Medical Surge/DME Caches

- Eleven (11) caches
 - Trailered/warehoused
 - 5500 “bed capacity”



Fatality Management Caches

- Three (3) caches – 24 decedents each; 72 total
- Mission: Expand healthcare facility capacity



Other Resources

- Highly Infectious Disease Caches and deployable, trained staff
- Respiratory Caches (oxygen generation)
- Ventilator Cache
- Metropolitan Areas Maintain
 - Pediatric Caches
 - Bariatric Surge Trailers
 - Limited Mobility Caches
- Missouri Disaster Medical Assistance Team
- Missouri Disaster Mortuary Team

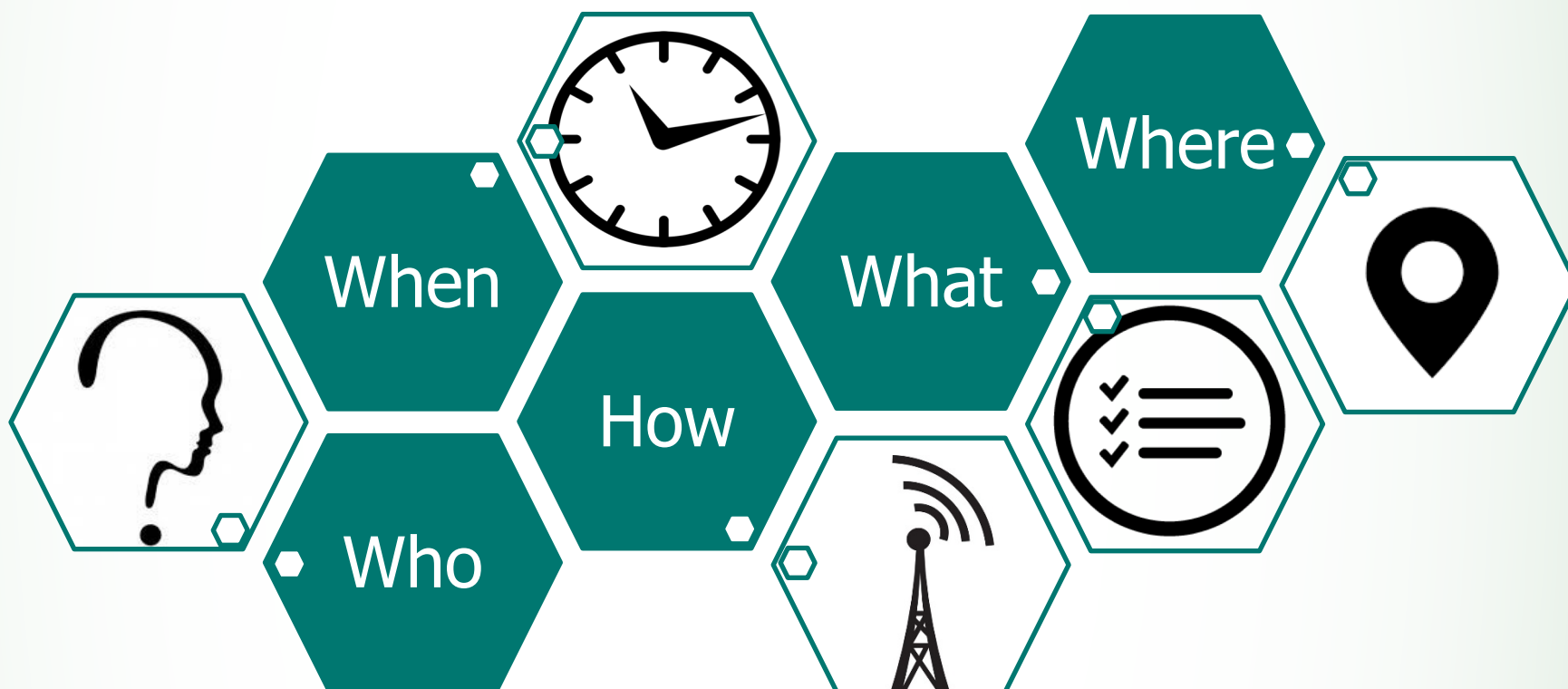
