





Earthquake Summit 2024



- 70 Hospitals
 - > 36 Acute Care Hospitals
 - > 9 Critical Access Hospitals
 - > 2 Long-Term Acute Care Hospitals
 - > 8 Psychiatric Hospitals
 - 4 state owned
 - 16 other hospitals have psych beds
 - > 8 Rehab Hospitals
 - 4 Specialty Hospitals
 - 2 Veteran's Hospitals
- Represents over 10,500 staffed beds




- Red: 2 hospitals
 - > 200 staffed beds

 - > 550 staffed beds

Red: 2 hospitals


Orange: 4 hospitals ^{750 staf}

> 725 staffed beds



Hospital Evacuation Vs. Sheltering in Place

- Infrastructure
 - Facility damage
 - Utility damage
 - Supplies on hand
- Triage
 - > Order of evacuations may differ by situation or facility

Specialty Populations

- Psychiatric patients
- Pediatric patients
 - > NOT just small adults
- ICU patients
- Complex patients

What does evacuation look like for these patients?



Hospitals Outside of Impact Zone

- Decompressing
 - Discharging patients
 - Moving patients to other levels of care or floors
 - > Thinking about elective procedures
- Potentially opening alternative space
- Responding to bed availability queries to indicate types and numbers of patients they can take

EMS and Transportation of Patients

- EMS Mutual Aid
- Capabilities of Ambulance
 - Buses
 - > ALS
 - > BLS
 - > Pediatric Capable
 - > Air
- Other Modes of transportation
 - Buses (who else is using)
 - > Clinic Vans

Messaging to Public About Seeking Care

- Important to message to public to seek the appropriate level of care
 - > Give examples of when to different facilities (urgent care, wait for your primary care, etc.)
- Other organizations to help amplify message

- DHSS OEC
- Hospital Mutual Aid Agreement
- EMResource Queries -
 - Bd Availability
 - > Infrastructure

Resumption of Operations

- Infrastructure
- Technology
- Sterilization
- Supplies
- Staff

Repopulation of Patients

- "Healthcare facilities should be re-populated as quickly as possible to return patients to primary care providers, access to family, mental health, and spiritual leaders, and to minimize the financial impact"
 - > In this disaster, this will take a long time!
- Coordinated closely between sending, transport and receiving facilities
 - > INVOLVE THE HCC!
