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Quality & Health Improvement / Emergency Preparedness / EMResource®/eICS

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Intermedix released <u>elCS Version 3.6</u> into production on July 5. A <u>recording</u> of the Intermedix Showcase highlights added features of the release.

Through ASPR Hospital Preparedness grant funding, MHA maintains Missouri's license for the Juvare eICS application and is able to offer access to hospitals and health care coalitions throughout Missouri. If your facility currently uses the Juvare eICS software for incident notification and response, I recommend that you watch the video for the latest information on updates to the system. The video is approximately 26 minutes long, and walks through how to customize incident objectives, create objective templates, and use new group messaging features. It also demonstrates a new objectives reporting capability and updates to various map icons.

EMResource and eICS are web-based applications within the Juvare suite of health care communication and response coordination software. Missouri hospitals and health care organizations utilize these applications for organizational and regional response coordination. The Missouri Hospital Association maintains the statewide license for these applications through funding from the ASPR Hospital Preparedness Program, CFDA
