Catastrophic Event

- An event on the New Madrid Seismic Zone of a magnitude
 6.0 or greater.
- Will cause numerous casualties
- Damage to an enormous amount of structures
- Disruption of government services
- Disturbance of transportation
- Interruption of essential services



Catastrophic Event

- There will be destructive aftershocks that will occur within minutes, days, and months following the main event
- Major pipelines and fuel storage facilities will fail
- Citizens should be prepared to be on their own for 72 hours...PLUS
 - Preferably WEEKS and MONTHS



Damage Estimates

- Hundreds of thousands, maybe millions of people will be without water, food, and shelter in the states surrounding the New Madrid Seismic Zone.
- Major bridges will be damaged and may not be able to be inspected until aftershocks subside
 - Approximately 240 major bridges damaged, with 25 being completely destroyed.
- Hospital bed availability down to approximately 22 percent of pre-earthquake numberes in most affected states
