Annual Show-Me Response Call Down Drill

Show-Me Response, Missouri's Emergency System for Advance Registration of Volunteer Healthcare Professionals (ESAR-VHP), was tested on May 14-15, 2019. The Assistant Secretary for Prepared-

15, 2019. The Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response performance standards for ESAR-VHP operational time frames call for the ability to generate a potential list of volunteers within 2 hours of a request, and a verified, deployableready list of volunteers within 24 hours of request.

The 2019 full-notice communications exercise was announced to registered volunteers and organization/unit administrators approximately 3 weeks prior to the actual exercise regarding the parameters, objectives, and expectations of the exercise. The announcement of the exercise was distributed through the Show-Me Response quarterly newsletter, The Call.

On May 14th, alerts were issued briefly describing a devastating earthquake in Southeast Missouri and requesting volunteers to indicate their ability/willingness to assist with response and recovery efforts. Exercise participants were given a 24-hour time frame in which to respond.

Approximately 7,650 volunteers were contacted during this exercise and asked to respond with one of the following options:

Positive response rate: ("I would be able to deploy if this were a real event) = 17%

Possible response rate ("I am unsure if I would be available if this were a real event") = 6%

Negative response rate ("I am unable to assist during this event") = 4%

2051 volunteers participated in the exercise. 58% of participants (n=1189) responded within 15 minutes of the request, increasing to 84% of participants (n=1729) responding within 2 hours – 989 of whom were willing to deploy.

The results of this exercise point to an engaged and extremely diverse cadre of volunteers, and highlight the state's capacity to successfully and effectively respond to requests for volunteers well within federal guidelines, recommendations, and best practices.
