ABOUT THE PROGRAM

To coordinate and support the identification, deployment, transportation and demobilization of chaplain resources utilized during large scale events and expanding incidents when additional resources are needed.

WHO CAN BE A MISSOURI DISASTER CHAPLAIN?

Applications are sought from Chaplains committed to honoring all faiths and cultures.

Application requirements include but are not limited to:

- Completion of NIMS training
- Certification from organization and/ or denomination
- Pastoral Education
- Healthcare, law enforcement or fire fighter chaplaincy certification and verification
- Background check
- A letter of recommendation



WHAT WILL I DO AS A MISSOURI DISASTER CHAPLAIN?

At the time of an emergency event or disaster, when chaplaincy needs are identified and requested, you could be contacted to determine your ability to deploy for that event. You would receive information such as:

- The nature and scope of the event
- The location of the event and staging area
- The anticipated activities to be performed
- Specific skills needed

You may also have the opportunity to participate in non-emergency services such as:
